
## **Tickets**

## **Commission Programme**

This year's commissions programme responds to the words carved into The Harris's monolithic architecture - a quote from a lecture on metaphysics by Sir William Hamilton

"TO LITERATURE, ARTS AND SCIENCE
ON EARTH THERE IS NOTHING GREAT BUT MAN
IN MAN THERE IS NOTHING GREAT BUT MIND
REVERENCE IN MAN THAT WHICH IS SUPREME
THE MENTAL RICHES YOU MAY HERE AQUIRE
ABIDE WITH YOU ALWAYS"

These words would have been part of the great discussion between Church and Science at that time. Now, as 'man' re-evaluates our relationship with the earth and its resources, these words resonate differently. In their responses, our four commissions reflect a societal shift in thinking about knowledge, culture, opportunity and supremacy, and ask questions about where the power needs to sit, and to make comment on the importance of culture and on who should have access to knowledge and opportunity.

#### THE HARRIS

In early 2020, Lancashire Encounter began working with three Bangladeshi heritage artists, Arry Nessa, Rahima Begum and Hashu Mohammed, with a view to visiting Bangladesh on a research mission investigating Folk Art. From this, the Bangla Folk Programme has developed to explore the heritage of Bangladeshi arts and their connection to communities within the UK and in Bangladesh. As we have not been able to travel, we began to develop a series of podcasts which investigate what folk art is within diverse communities, delving deeper into different forms of folk art as free form creativity. These podcasts are available on the Bangla Folk YouTube Channel.

Folk Is A Feminist Issue (FIAFI) launched in September 2021 and advocates for women-led folk arts. It aims to reclaim 'folk' as the powerhouse that it is, not just as a musical genre, but as an agent for resistance and change in the arts and culture, and beyond. To find out more visit:




